We have truly had a transformative year at our Foundation. We changed our fiscal year and hired new staff, who worked diligently to stabilize our infrastructure while continuing to provide services to individuals and their families affected by epilepsy. The past fiscal year was filled with challenges, which we met head-on to accomplish the following:

- The Foundation served over 340 individuals with, or affected by, epilepsy
- We instituted the Seizure Training for School Nurses/School Personnel curriculum so all school employees (bus drivers, administrative staff, teachers, facilities personnel, volunteers) are aware of the different types of seizures and seizure first aid
- Twenty-eight volunteers committed their time to us so we could utilize their talents rather than pay for them
- Our donor base grew to over 780 individuals
- The location of Camp Candlelight was changed to a higher elevation with cooler temperatures and improved facilities
